
Just the beginning...

- Only 10% of juveniles survive their first year
- Black Oystercatcher fledging success: 15% per nest (Monterey Co 2012)
- Black Oystercatchers reach sexual maturity at about 5 years but need to become sufficiently skilled at foraging to successfully feed a family
- Western gulls have to survive 4 years before reaching adulthood
- All cormorant species reach sexual maturity at 2 years
