Sonoma Coast State Park

The purpose of this position is to assist in the operation of the Visitor Center in Jenner and to further the mission of California State Parks: “To provide for the health, inspiration, and education of the people of California by helping to preserve the state’s extraordinary biological diversity, protecting its most valued natural and cultural resources, and creating opportunities for high-quality outdoor recreation.”

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Inform visitors about Sonoma Coast State Park and surrounding areas on the following topics:
 - Hiking, camping, fishing, boating
 - Parks safety and regulations
 - History of the area
 - Maps and local directions
- Manage the Nature Store within the Visitor Center:
 - Sell store inventory
 - Organize and display products
 - Open and close the store
 - Accounting
- Wear provided name badge and California State Parks Volunteer patch while volunteering
- Keep track of volunteer time

Skills and Qualifications:

- Knowledge or willingness to learn and share information on the natural and cultural history of the Sonoma Coast
- Good communication skills
- Ability to work with a cash register and money

Time Commitment:

A minimum of one shift per month which consists of either a 3 hour weekend shift or a 4 hour weekday shift

Training:

Jenner Visitor Center Training will be provided one-on-one and arrangements to shadow an experienced volunteer will be provided as needed. Bear in Mind EEO Training is required within 60 days of completing the paperwork and subsequently every two years.
